

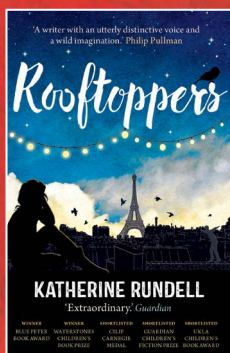

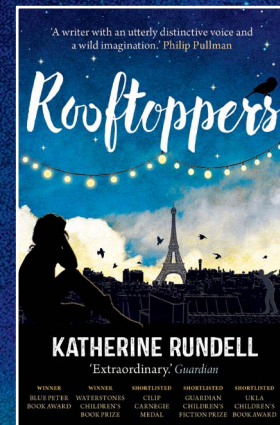
WANTED:
